A. Scholarship reimbursement is priority based, first come, first served and dependent upon funds available.

B. Tuition Reimbursements for the first 4 priorities are distributed **AFTER THE CLOSE OF EACH ROUND**.

C. All tuition Reimbursements for the 5th priority will be held until the end of Round 3. Reimbursement for the 5th priority will be based on remaining funds and distributed on a first come, first serve basis and dependent upon funds available.

Application Procedures and Instructions (For School Year 2021-2022)



Patch is Hawaii's only Child Care Resource & Referral Agency whose mission is to support and improve the quality and availability of care for young people in Hawaii. With the generous support of the State of Hawaii Department of Human Services, PATCH is able to provide for the professional development needs of the child care community by administering the Early Childhood Education Scholarships.

Supporting Hawaii's Child Care Needs

This Reimbursement Scholarship reimburses monies to applicants who have passed eligible courses. Funding for this scholarship is limited, priority is based on 5 priorities and on a first come first served basis. The five (5) priority groups for the scholarship award, see information below and attachment for more details. Applicants must be living in Hawaii.

What does the ECE Scholarship cover?

- Only **tuition** of eligible college coursework taken from accredited **Hawaii-based colleges**. Books, student fees, online technical fees, etc. are not covered.
- CDA direct assessment or renewal fees.
- PACE classes that have been **converted to college credits**.
- Priority is given to those applicants working in a DHS licensed or registered facility
- The ECE Scholarship does not cover any courses taken from out-of-state colleges, whether online or campus-based.

What is the criteria for coursework?

- Early childhood or child development focused coursework
- College courses completed between June 2021 and May 2022.
- PACE classes converted to college credits. Transcripts should reflect the Fall 2021 and/or Spring 2022 semester.
- CDA Credential dated on or after June 1, 2021 through May 31, 2022.
- Paid courses towards CDA credential
- Eligible courses taken through Hawaii-based colleges. If course is not listed, please submit application with ECE course description.

What is the maximum amount I can receive?

- \$750 per round
- Continued funding for each round is contingent upon monies available from previous round.
- Applicants can qualify for more than one round.
- Other forms of financial aid are first applied towards the tuition when calculating scholarship amounts. Any remaining tuition is then applied towards this scholarship.
- Tuition Reimbursements are distributed after the close of each round for priorities 1-4.

Priority for Scholarships is as follows:

- Please see ECE scholarship priorities attachment
- Applicants that do not fall into priorities 1-4 will be reimbursed after the close of Round 3, dependent on remaining funds, regardless of when the applications are submitted. Those in priority 5 may still be reimbursed for multiple rounds as long as applications are submitted based on the deadlines stated for each scholarship round.

Deadlines: Applications must be postmarked on or before the deadline of each Round.

Round 1: August 31, 2021

Round 2: January 15, 2022

Round 3: May 31, 2022*

*(Send in transcript on or before June 30, 2022).

ECE Scholarship Priorities

Priority given to applicants employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility.

- Priority 1, 2, and 3 are for applicants employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility working toward an Associates, Bachelors or CDA
- Priority 4 are for applicants employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility working towards their master's degree
- Priority 5 are for applicants not employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility

Priority #1

- A. Reimburse the cost of tuition to any individual taking early childhood education (ECE) or child development (CD) college-level classes working toward an associates or bachelors degree;
- B. Reimburse the assessment fee costs to any individual who is trying to obtain or renew a Child Development Associate (CDA).

Priority #2

- A. Reimburse the cost of tuition to any individual taking **NON**-early childhood education (ECE) or **NON**-child development (CD) "core" college-level classes that is required in order to graduate with an associate's or bachelor's degree;
 - Priority for scholarships under 2. shall be given:

1st priority: To individuals currently employed at a DHS licensed child care facility on an approved waiver (Teacher waiver or Assistant teacher waiver) and is working toward CDA or ECE/CD degree.

2nd priority: To an individual has taken one of the possible courses would need to have been taken, dependent on the University of Hawaii campus' (including UH community colleges) course offering:

- ECED 110;
- ECED 105; or
- ECED 131; AND
- the student has declared ECE as the major with the UH community college campus the student is enrolled at.

Example: individual taking a non-ECE class that is required in order to graduate with an associates or bachelor's degree, they would have had to have taken one of the above 3 classes and declare their major by filing it with UH community college campus the student is enrolled at.

Priority #3

- A. Reimburse the cost of tuition or courses to any individual taking PACE courses or online CDA courses working towards obtaining their CDA credential.

Priority #4

- A. Individuals employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility working towards a master's degree in early childhood education.

Priority #5

- A. Individuals not employed at a DHS licensed or registered facility falling in priority #1, #2, #3 and #4.
- All applications will be held to the end of scholarship round 3;
 - Pending available funds, applications will be processed based on date received;
 - Applicants need to submit their applications based on application deadlines per scholarship round;
 - Applicants may qualify for multiple rounds of scholarships. However, applications must be postmarked on or before the deadlines stated per each scholarship round;
AND
 - Applications will be reimbursed after the close of Round 3 regardless when the application(s) are submitted.
